

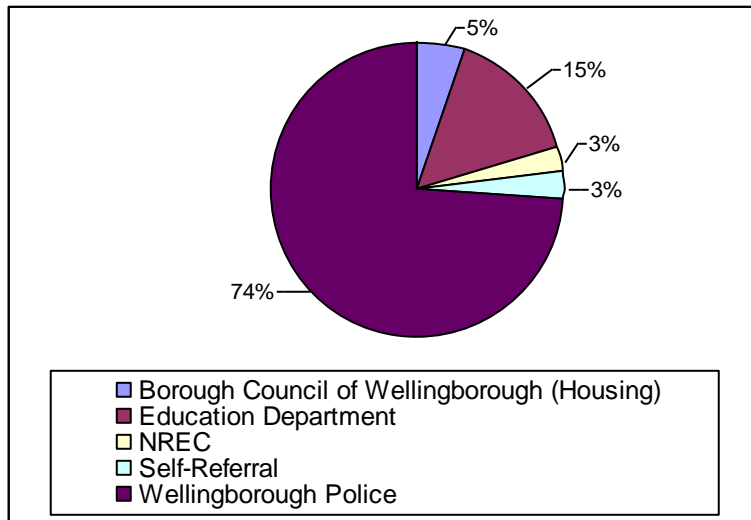
## Wellingborough Hate Incident Reports Jan – Dec 2007

The table above clearly specifies that the majority of reports received for Wellingborough for this period came from the Police. Reports received from the Police were up by 8% compared to the previous year. There was a diminution of 16 reports from the Education Department compared to Jan - Dec 2006.

Reports from the Borough Council of Wellingborough increased by 50% compared to the previous year, nevertheless front line training may still be beneficial to further encourage active reporting of hate incidents. During Jan – Dec 2007, victim support did not submit a single hate incident to the NREC, this is a concerning matter as multi agency working is a crucial element for co - ordination agencies in order to effectively fulfill their roles in performance managing each individual case enabling them to tackle hate incidents.

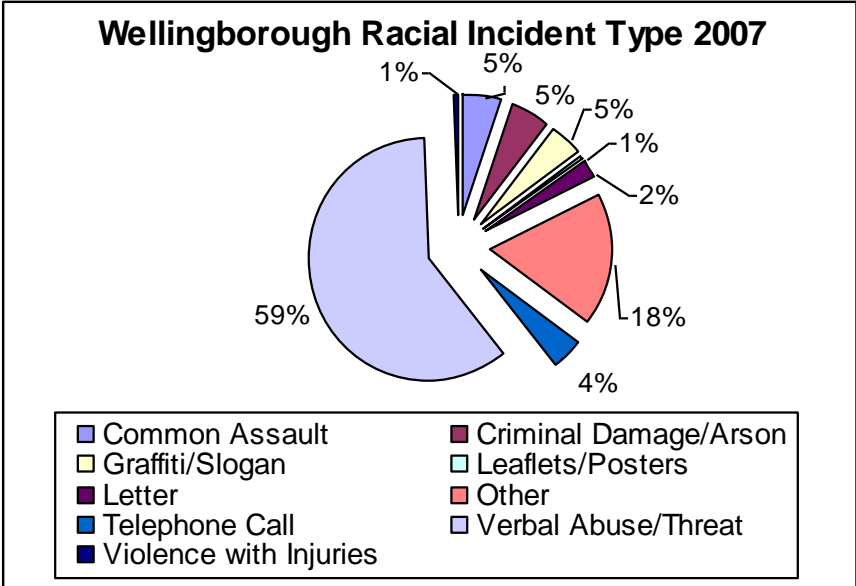
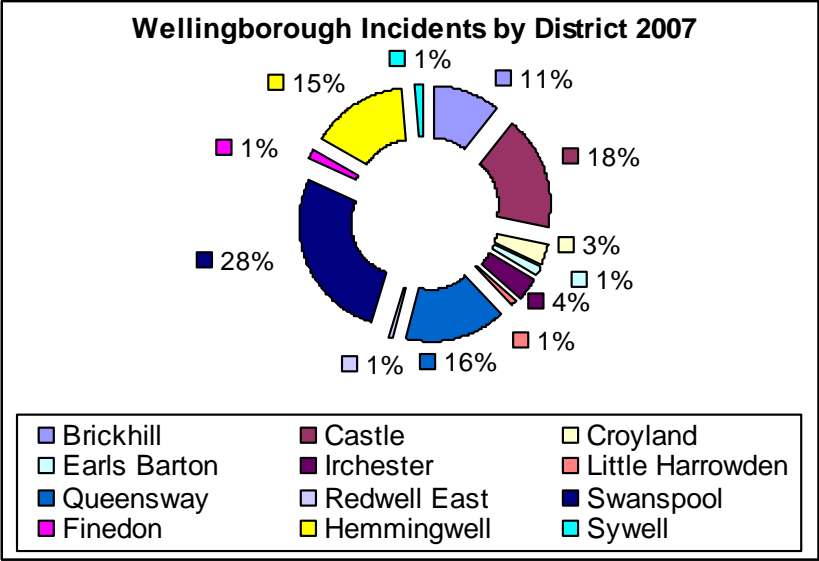

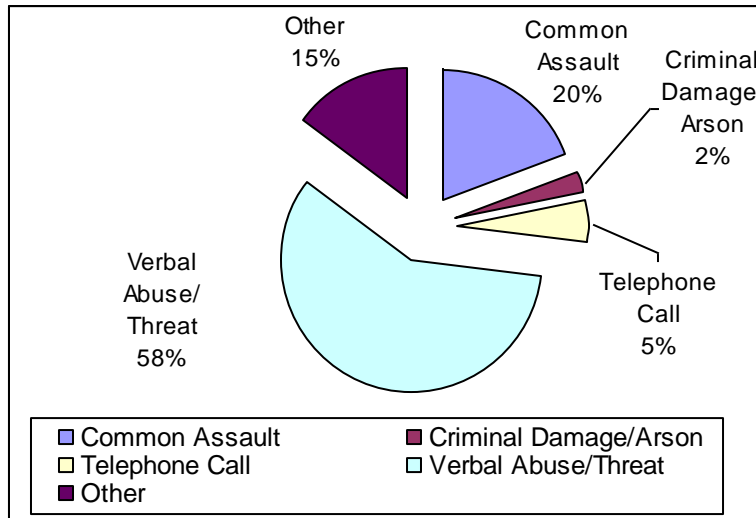

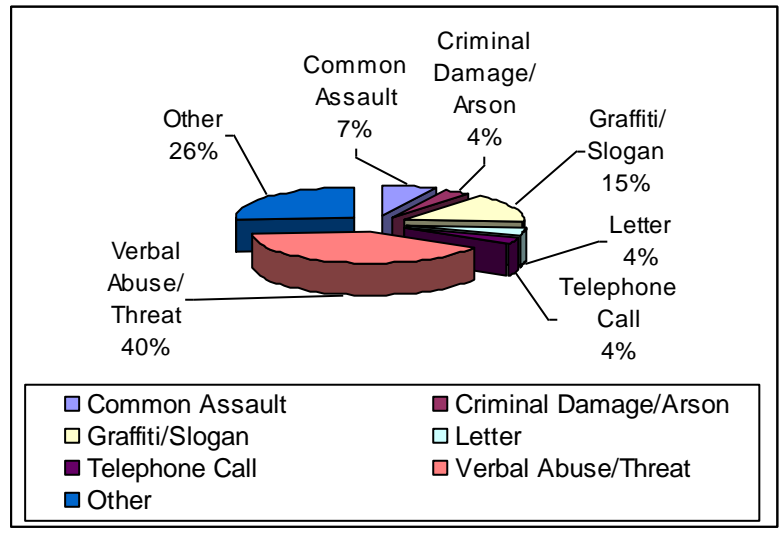
By analysing the data it is evident that the top three districts in Wellingborough that had the highest reported hate incidents were:

- 1) Swanspool 41
- 2) Castle 27
- 3) Queensway 25

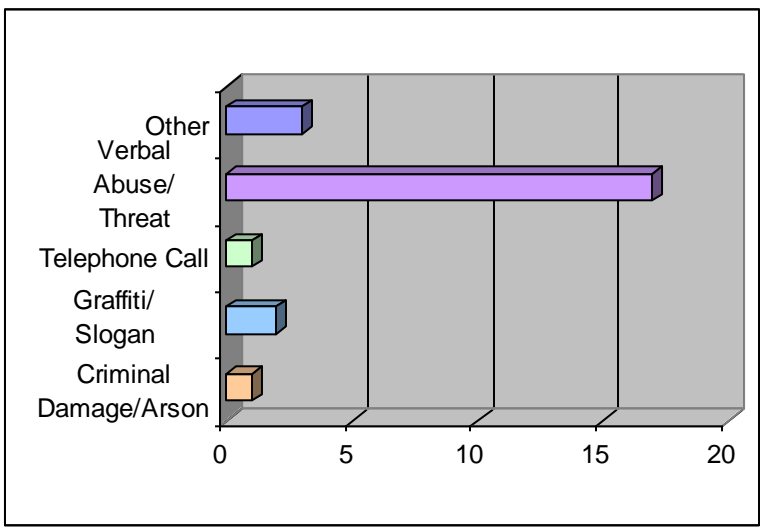
**Swanspool Ward Type of Incident 2007**

In Jan – Dec 2007 the district with the highest reported hate incidents in Wellingborough was Swanspool with **41** reports. That is an increase by **27 %** of reports from Swanspool from Jan – Dec 2006. There has been a steady rise in reports received in Swanspool over the last few years but Jan – Dec 2007 showed a greater increase. In comparison to the previous year the reports received for Castle ward dropped by **18 %**. Queensway showed an increase in **8** reports compared to 2006.

The most common reported type of Incident in Wellingborough in 2007 is Verbal Abuse/Threat; this has been a trend for the last few years. The second is Other, which can be Racially Aggravated Crime, or this can include Homophobic or Disablist Crimes. The Third most common types of hate Incidents reported in Wellingborough are Graffiti/Slogan, Criminal Damage and Common Assault.
